

Replication Package for “Means-Tested Transfers in the U.S.: Facts and Parametric Estimates”

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1 Data Availability Statement

All code necessary to reproduce the results from the publicly available data are included. All code necessary to reproduce the results from the publicly available data is included. The authors have the rights to redistribute all materials contained in this replication package. Some datasets are included directly in the package, while others are publicly available and may require registration with the respective data providers. No required materials have been omitted due to legal, licensing, or confidentiality restrictions.

1.1 Data included

The replication uses publicly available series for annual Fair Market Rents (FMRs) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to impute the value of housing assistance (`data/input/FMR_A11_1983_2022.csv`). These series are publicly available and are not restricted.

Data on real GDP per capita for the United States are obtained from the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis’s FRED database (series `A939RX0Q048SBEA`), available at <https://fred.stlouisfed.org>. The series reports real gross domestic product per capita in chained 2017 dollars, at a quarterly frequency and seasonally adjusted annual rate. The raw data file is included in this replication package (`data/input/Real_GDP_per_Capita_1998_2016_USA.txt`) and can also be downloaded directly from FRED. The file used here was retrieved on September 24, 2025.

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Data on the Consumer Price Index for the United States are obtained from the Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis’s FRED database ([Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, 2024](#)). The series reports the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (series `CPIAUCNS`), at a monthly frequency and not seasonally adjusted. The raw data file is included in this replication package (`data/input/us_monthly_cpi_notadjusted.txt`) and can also be downloaded directly from FRED. The file used here was retrieved on April 16, 2024.

Data on aggregate government expenditures on social programs are compiled from several sources and provided in the file `data/input/agg_expenditures.dta`, which is included in this replication package. Expenditure on Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) through 2012 is based on [Ziliak \(2015\)](#), Figure 4.2, and supplemented with TANF Financial Data from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, for subsequent years. Expenditures on the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) are drawn from the USDA series on spending for food and nutrition assistance for fiscal years 1970–2023, available at the Economic Research Service ([U.S. Department of Agriculture, Economic Research Service, n.d.](#)). Spending on housing assistance is taken from the White House Office of Management and Budget Historical Tables, Table 8.7 (Outlays for Discretionary Programs: 1962–2029) ([Office of Management and Budget, n.d.](#)). Spending on Medicaid is obtained from the National Health Expenditure Tables published by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, specifically Table 3 (National Health Expenditures by Source of Funds) ([Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, n.d.](#)).

1.2 Data not included but publicly available

The replication uses data from the Current Population Survey (CPS) for the period 2013–2016. These data are obtained from IPUMS CPS ([Flood et al. 2025](#)), publicly available at <https://cps.ipums.org>. The raw CPS data are not redistributed in this package. Users must register and download the data directly from IPUMS CPS. The following variables must be selected when building the extract: `year`, `serial`, `month`, `cpsid`, `asecflag`, `hflag`, `asecwt`, `pernum`, `cpsidp`, `asecwt`, `age`, and `inctot`. The extract should be downloaded in Stata fixed-width format (`.dat`) named `cps_00065.dat`, with the corresponding `.do` file named `cps_00065.do` used to read in the data. These files need to be placed in the folder `data/inputs`.

The replication uses data from the Survey of Consumer Finances (SCF) for the year 2013. These data are obtained from the Federal Reserve Board, publicly available at <https://www.federalreserve.gov/econres/scfindex.htm>. The raw SCF data are not redistributed in this package. Users must download the 2013 public dataset directly from the Federal Reserve Board website. The following variables are used in the analysis: `YY1`, `Y1`, `X42001`, `X14`, `X5702`, `X5704`, `X5706`, `X5708`, `X5710`, `X5712`, and `X5714`. The dataset should be downloaded in Stata format and named `p13i6.dta`. This file needs to be placed in the folder `data/input`. This replication package uses data from the Survey of Income and Program Participation (SIPP) listed in Table 1, publicly available from the U.S. Census Bureau and the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER).

The replication requires the following files in Table 1, grouped by SIPP panel and file type. Files are organized into Stata programs (.do), dictionary files (.dct), compressed raw files (.zip), and extracted data files (.dat). The authors had legitimate access to these data for research purposes. The SIPP raw data are publicly available and are not redistributed in this package. Users must download the data directly from the Census Bureau or NBER.

Data on health insurance prices is constructed from the Kaiser Family Foundation’s *Employer Health Benefits* annual survey, which reports the cost of Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) policies by region (Northeast, Midwest, South, and West) for the years 1999–2016. The file (`data/input/prices_medicaid.dta`) contains the annual premium cost of single and family HMO policies by region and year. These prices are used to impute a monetary value for Medicaid coverage: households with a single Medicaid enrollee are assigned the cost of a single HMO policy, while households with multiple enrollees are assigned the lesser of (i) the sum of individual single-policy costs or (ii) the cost of one family policy. Premiums for elderly or disabled individuals are scaled by a factor of 2.5 to reflect their greater medical needs. When a household’s region is unavailable (0.08% of the 2014 panel), the national average premium is used.

2 Contents of the Replication Package

The replication package contains:

`codes/` Contains all code files and their logs written to `codes/logs/`.

`data/` Contains two subdirectories:

- `input/` stores all primitive input files, including raw SIPP survey files.
- `output/` is the destination for all intermediate and final data files produced by the code.

`figures/` Contains all generated figures in PDF format. The package produces 13 main figures (Figures 1–13) and figures for Appendices B–E, covering topics such as aggregate transfer spending over time (Figure 1), the relation between pre- and post-transfer income (Figure 2), transfer magnitudes and coverage trends (Figures 4–5), concentration of transfers (Figure 6), cyclicalities of transfers (Figure 7), unconditional and conditional transfer schedules by income quantile and marital status (Figures 8–10), the earned-income penalty (Figure 11), and transfers by wealth (Figures 12–13). Many figures consist of multiple component PDF files that are combined in the paper.

`tables/` Contains all generated tables as `.tex` files. The package produces 13 main tables (Tables 1–13) and tables for Appendices B–C, covering descriptive statistics (Tables 1–2), transfers and coverage by income quantile (Tables 3–8), transfers by marital status and children (Tables 4, 6), elderly and disabled households (Tables 9), pre- and post-transfer income inequality (Tables 10–11), and structural estimates from the Gamma and Ricker welfare function models (Tables 12–13). Most tables are assembled from multiple component `.tex` files.

`docs/` An index of all figures (with figure numbers, titles, and file names) is provided in `figures_index.xlsx`, and an analogous index for all tables is provided in `tables_index.xlsx`.

3 Software and Hardware Requirements

- Stata version 19.5.
- Memory requirement: at least 8GB RAM recommended.

Python

- Python version: 3.12.7; Distribution: Packaged by Anaconda, Inc.
- Memory requirement: at least 8GB RAM recommended.

Running time:

- 37min on MacBook Air M4 2025.

4 Instructions to Reproduce All Results

Requirements

- **Stata:** The Stata executable is selected automatically based on the operating system (`StataMP.app` on macOS, `StataMP-64.exe` on Windows, `stata-mp` on Linux). If your installation path differs from the defaults in `codes/calling_masterfile.py`, update the `stata_executables` dictionary accordingly.
- **Python:** version 3.10 or higher.
- **Raw SIPP data:** zip files must be placed in `data/input/raw_files/` before running the pipeline (see the data availability statement).

Step 1 — Install the Python environment (once)

From the repository root, run:

```
bash codes/install_env.sh
```

This creates a virtual environment at `.venv/` in the repository root and installs all required Python packages listed in `codes/requirements.txt` (`pandas`, `numpy`, `matplotlib`, `seaborn`, `statsmodels`). This step only needs to be run once.

Step 2 — Run the full replication pipeline

```
bash codes/run_replication.sh
```

The script auto-detects the repository root as the parent directory of `codes/`, so no path configuration is required as long as the replication package is kept intact. If you need to run the pipeline from a different location, pass the root path explicitly:

```
bash codes/run_replication.sh --root /path/to/replication/package
```

To skip re-extracting the raw zip files on a subsequent run:

```
bash codes/run_replication.sh --skip-unzip
```

What the pipeline does

The shell script activates the virtual environment and calls `codes/calling_masterfile.py`, which orchestrates the following steps in order:

1. **Unzip raw data.** All SIPP zip files in `data/input/raw_files/` are extracted in place. Temporary `.dat` files are deleted automatically at the end of the run.
2. **Run Stata.** `codes/master_execution.do` is executed, which calls the numbered Stata scripts
Each script writes a log to `codes/logs/` and saves its outputs to `data/output/`. All tables are written to `tables/` and all figures produced by Stata are written to `figures/`.
3. **Run Python files creating figures and tables.** Three Python scripts are called sequentially: `17_make_heatmaps.py`, `18_interpolate_quarters.py`, `19_cycles_GDP_vs_all.py` and `20_scf2013_inequality.py`. These produce the remaining figures and tables and write them to `figures/` and `tables/`.

Upon successful completion, all tables and figures referenced in the paper are present in `tables/` and `figures/`, respectively. An index mapping each table and figure number to its file name is provided in `tables_index.xlsx` and `figures_index.xlsx`.
